before it's too late.

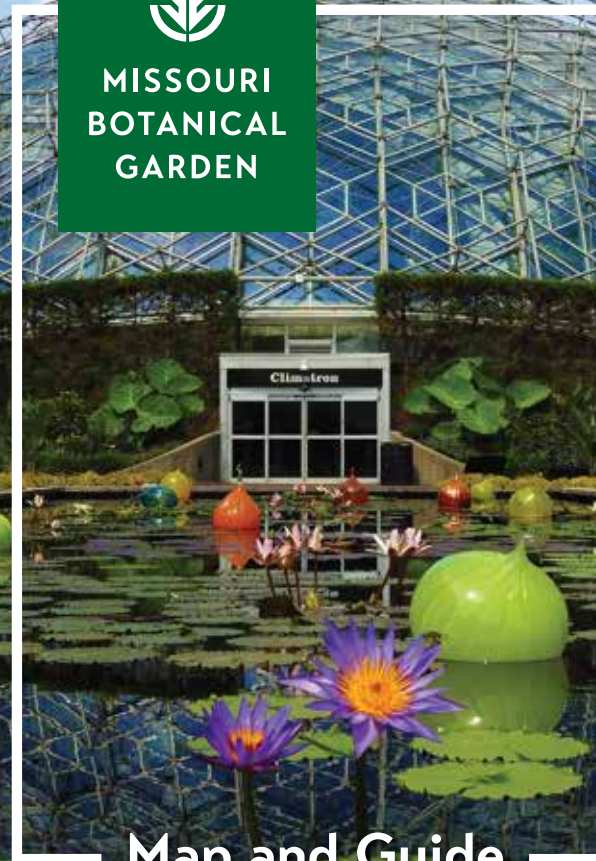
